This Tax has now been abolished with the approval of the Secretary of State.

Another important event was the creation of a new district in June last, called the Gonja District, with the important town of Salaga as its headquarters.

This has already led to a great increase in trade, and numbers of natives who left Salaga and its neighbouring villages a few years ago, owing to the insecurity of life and property, are now gradually returning and rebuilding their houses.

A station was established at Salaga in June, 1902, and I am glad to be able to state the result has been most satisfactory. There has been a great influx of trade, and during the last three months nearly 500 new houses have been erected. I consider that these satisfactory results are in a great measure due to the tact and skill which Captain Lonsdale, the District Commissioner, has displayed in his dealings with the various Chiefs, who have had heavy calls made upon them in the supplying of labour for the transport of stores and construction of the road from Dogon Kade to Khobian.
